2025 BELL CANADIAN SWIMMING TRIALS

Strong Performances and Personal Bests

The 2025 Bell Canadian Swimming Trials brought together the country's top athletes for one of the most prestigious events on the national swimming calendar. Held annually to showcase Canada's best talent and often serve as a selection meet for international competitions, the Trials are a true test of skill, resilience, and elite performance. Our ROW swimmers rose to the occasion, proudly representing our club with determination and excellence on the national stage.

Alec Elliott delivered an impressive performance, capturing a silver medal in the Para 400 Free on Day 2 and competing strongly in the 100 Fly and 200 IM later in the week. His efforts earned him a spot on the Para Worlds team - congratulations, Alec! Le Anne Du had a breakthrough meet, achieving a personal milestone by breaking the one-minute barrier in the 100 Free time trial (59.78) and adding best times in both the 50 Free and 200 Back. Sunny X also stood out, making the final in the 200 Back, and taking on a tough lineup of events throughout the week, including the 100 Back, 200 Fly, and the grueling 1500 Free.


ROW Swimmers Shine at Canada's Premier Meet

WESTERN REGION LC CHAMPIONSHIPS

ROW Competes at Prestigious WOSA Regional Championships

From June 12 to 15, ROW sent a strong team of 57 swimmers – 28 girls and 29 boys - to compete at the prestigious WOSA Regional Championships in Windsor. As one of the most competitive regional meets in Ontario, the event brought together top swimmers from clubs across the Western region, offering a high-level racing environment and an important stone toward provincial and stepping national-level competition. Our team rose to the challenge and delivered exceptional results.

Personal Bests, Podiums, and Team **Spirit Shine**

An incredible 95% of our swimmers achieved at least one personal best in their individual events, demonstrating both the depth of talent and the hard work put in throughout the season. ROW swimmers earned a total of 21 gold, 18 silver, and 13 bronze medals in individual events. Our relay teams also had a strong showing, winning gold in the Mixed 10 & Under 200 Medley, silver in the Boys 11-12 200 Medley, and bronze in multiple 10 & Under relays for both girls and boys. Outside the pool, swimmers had a chance to relax and bond at the outdoor film festival hosted just steps from the sport centre – a fun way to unwind between sessions. It was a weekend full of fast swims, great memories, and club pride!

Club Records Fall in Etobicoke Showdown

Our ROW swimmers had an outstanding performance at the 2025 Age Group International Meet held in Etobicoke from June 6 to 8, bringing home an impressive total of 35 medals-17 gold, 10 silver, and 8 bronze. The meet drew top swimmers from across the province and beyond, and our athletes rose to the occasion with incredible swims, strong team spirit, and remarkable results.

Several swimmers broke club records during the competition. Olivia Snyder set the pace in the 12 & under girls category, rebreaking her own club records in three events: the 200m freestyle with a time of 2:12.18, the 50m backstroke in 33.03, and the 200m backstroke in 2:30.02-all while claiming gold. On the boys' side, Ethan Wu set a new 13-14 boys club record in the 50m backstroke with a time of 29.12. Beckett Shannon also delivered standout performances, breaking the 13-14 boys club records in the 100m breaststroke (1:11.01) and 50m breaststroke (31.89). Stella Neable added to the excitement with new club records of 1:06.98 in the 100m butterfly and 30.62 in the 50m butterfly.

Congratulations to all swimmers for their hard work and success. Your achievements continue to raise the bar and inspire the entire ROW community!

ONTARIO SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Strong Team Finish at OSC

Our team delivered another impressive performance at the Ontario Swimming Championships, finishing 8th overall in the province. This marks our second consecutive Top 10 team finish, a testament to the dedication, depth, and consistency of our athletes and coaches. Over the course of five long and demanding days, our swimmers demonstrated not only physical endurance but also mental strengthracing with purpose, focus, and incredible team spirit.

Standout Performances & Club Records

The meet was packed with highlights, and our swimmers rose to the occasion with clutch performances and several new club records. Lucas LB opened the meet with a strong swim in the 200 IM, breaking the club record for 15/16 Boys. In the 15/16 Cirls category, Mia T earned a silver medal in the 100 backstroke and added a bronze in the 200 back. Stella N had a breakout meet in the 12 Girls category, capturing silver in the 200 IM and racing to gold in the 200 butterfly-setting a new club record in the process. Olivia S delivered one of the most remarkable performances of the meet. She won gold in the 100 free and 100 back, both in club record time, and earned silver in the 200 back and 200 free-with the 200 free also setting a new club mark. Her consistency and versatility across multiple strokes and distances made her one of the top performers of the championship. Eliza L brought home a bronze medal in the 11 & under 200 fly, while Tommy F earned bronze in the 12 Boys 200 fly with a gritty finish. Sophie R claimed silver in the 13/14 Cirls 200 fly and tied the Junior Trials Qualification Standard, a major milestone in her competitive development. Sunny X added another medal to the tally with silver in the 15/16 Girls 800 free. Para swimmer Alec Elliott was also a force in the pool, winning gold in the 50 free and competing strongly in the 100 fly, showing what determination and elite-level preparation can achieve.

Relay Record and Team Cohesion

Relays are where the energy and unity of a team truly shine, and our 12 Girls stepped up in a big way. The 4x50 freestyle relay team-made up of Olivia S, Madison T, Stella N, and Eliza L-not only raced with heart but also broke the club record in the event. It was a special moment for the team and a symbol of the shared progress made this season. The chemistry and trust among these young swimmers were on full display, setting the tone for future relays to come.

High Point Recognition

In addition to podium finishes, several swimmers were among the top-ranked athletes for high point awards in their age groups-recognizing consistent excellence across multiple events. Olivia S tied for second overall in the 12 Cirls category, while Stella N finished fourth and Eliza L ranked 10th in the 11 & under group. In the 15/16 Girls division, Mia T and Sunny X placed 10th and 11th respectively, and Sophie R tied for 12th among all 14 & under Cirls. Tommy F also tied for 12th in the 12 Boys category. Meanwhile, Alec Elliott was crowned Overall Para Male High Point Winner, a well-earned honor for his outstanding swims.

Growth, Grit, and Maturity

As we close the chapter on this OSC meet, the future looks bright. From personal breakthroughs to record-setting swims, every performance contributed to our shared success. We extend our heartfelt thanks to the athletes, families, and coaching staff who made this possible. 

The outdoor environment also provided an ideal early preparation for upcoming competitions, particularly the Ontario Open Water Championships at Gull Lake.

















